Ms. Coleman is an award-winning author, journalist and inspirational speaker. Her hardcover debut novel from Time Warner Books, *Potter Sprints*, has garnered national media attention, critical acclaim, and endorsements from bestselling authors. Britta's "Practically Parenting" column is published as a regular newspaper feature, and her writing has appeared in FYI Television Features, Heroes for Humanity, [Authorlink](#), the Amarillo Globe-News and the Fort Worth Star-Telegram. She was recently given the Barnes & Noble Lone Star Scribe Award for excellence in writing.

Britta enjoys speaking to groups about the craft of writing and daring to live out ones dreams without running away from home. She lives in Fort Worth with her husband, two children, and a fussy Chihuahua named Rosie.

Carolyn Harrod

Ms. Harrod holds a Master's degree in English with an emphasis in fiction writing from UNT. She has taught writing and fiction at the college level. Currently, she is editor of the Denton Scramble, a community magazine focusing on arts and politics in Denton, Texas. She resides in Denton with her husband and three-year-old daughter.

Candace "Candy" Havens

Candy is one of the nation's leading entertainment writers. Candy has interviewed countless celebrities, including Tom Cruise, Nicholas Cage, Tom Hanks, Susan Sarandon and George Clooney.

In addition to writing columns on everything Hollywood, she has published biographies on *Buffy the Vampire* creator Joss Whedon, and actor George Clooney.

A Texas native, Candy attended Houston's prestigious High School for the Performing and Visual Arts and the University of North Texas.

A 17-year veteran of the entertainment industry, Candy has written thousands of articles and conducted thousands of interviews. She attributes her success as an entertainment journalist to two rules. One, treat each interview like it was a one-on-one chat between two friends. Two, never be afraid to go after the interview you want, no matter how famous the subject.

Candy was a columnist for Tribune Media for 15 years, where she wrote weekly columns for an overall audience of 44 million readers. Candy is also an entertainment critic for the Dorsey Gang on 96.3 KSCS, which broadcasts in the Dallas/Fort Worth area, and the Managing Editor of FYI Television Features. Her most recent books are *Joss Whedon: The Genius Behind Buffy*, and the new anthology *Five Seasons of Angel*.

Dave Lieber

This award-winning speaker is also known as the Yankee Cowboy, and is a senior columnist for the Fort Worth Star-Telegram. He is a member of the National Speakers Association.

Dave is a Director of the National Society of Newspaper Columnists Education Foundation, co-founder of one of North Texas' largest children's charities, Summer Santa, and winner of many awards.

Several years ago, he was named winner of the nationally acclaimed Will Rogers Humanitarian Award, which is given annually to the U.S. newspaper columnist "whose work best exemplifies the high ideals of the beloved philosopher-humorist who used his public forum for the benefit of his human beings."

Recently, the Press Club of Dallas gave him the prestigious 2003 Katie Award for Best Columnist in Texas, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Arkansas, Colorado and New Mexico. In 2004, Dave was named Star-Telegram Editorial Employee of the Year.
